


Murder and Mayhem True Crime Accounts



The dynamic writing duo, Renee Geving and Cecelia McKeig, have produced their latest paperback about crimes in early Cass County, several of which have never been solved. Renee and Cecelia utilized the newspaper archives and the state archives to put together these accounts.

If summer readers are looking for a good murder story of the north woods, a gripping tale of love gone wrong, or an unsolved murder of a hundred years ago, this is the book to have. The book follows the stories from newspaper accounts of the day and court records and addresses such pointed questions as, Who killed Patrick Hawley and buried his body in a manure pile? Who shot George Barclay on a cold October night at Pine River? Was Cass Lake's Dr. Dumas an outstanding citizen, wrongly accused, or a Jekyll and Hyde character? Why was there only one hanging in Cass County? Was Chounard an example to the rest of the would-be offenders?

"Dan Dennehey, who, as all of Walker knows, was acting in the capacity of nightwatch walked into Hulick's saloon, began hurling opporbrious epithets at Swan Anderson, the bartender, and said, "I'm off duty now, and I'm going to kill you," and proceeded to carry out his threat. He leveled his revolver and fired, the shot missing Anderson's head by about two inches and burrowing a hole through the thick frame of the big mirror behind the bar." A Narrow Escape, pg. 25.

The story is developed in the words of the first-hand witnesses, and in the editorials of the day. There will be a book signing on July 15^{th} from 11:00 - 2:00 at the Little Apple Bookstore. The book is currently being sold at the Cass County Museum, at Little Apple Bookstore in Walker, and at Lori's Luvs in Longville for \$20.

Cass County Research Center

The research center is staffed by the Cass County Historical Society at the Cass County Museum in Walker. Through the winter, research help is available by appointment. The research library, obituary indexes, newspaper microfilm, and other archival materials are accessible for a \$10 research fee for nonmembers.



Pictured are Dan Eikenberry on the left and Carl Berg on the right of the paddlewheel of the Leila D. that sits on the lawn in front of the Cass County Museum. She was the first privately-owned steamboat to ply the waters of Leech Lake in 1895. Carl's father, Ole Berg, donated the paddlewheel to the museum. This June, Carl replaced all the wood at his own expense. Dan gave it a coat of paint and together they put the paddlewheel back together for our visitors to enjoy.

Although Cass County reduced the amount of their donation to our historical society this year, they have been generous in providing funds for a new entrance to the mu-




McKinley School was built in the NW 1/4 Section 9 of Loon Lake Township around 1898. The first school in this township was in Section 17. It closed in 1915 and the pupils went to McKinley School. In 1919, McKinley School was moved to the corner of the SE 1/4 of section 9. It burned in 1930. This picture of the McKinley School, shared by Joyce Lotze, was taken in 1915. Three students were identified. Back row first boy on far left: Martin Melin. Back row third boy from left: Victor Larson. Back row: second girl from the right: Joyce Cochran Thompson.

Martin Melin was the son of Jonas and Cecil (Oberg) Melin. Jonas came from Sweden in 1883. He had worked in the St. Cloud Stone Quarry, where he lost his thumb and two fingers in a blasting accident. He homesteaded 160 acres in Section 4 in Loon Lake Township in 1896. He felled the red pines and built a cabin and a log barn for his team of oxen. In 1900, he married Cecil Oberg, a Norwegian immigrant. Jonas bought 40 acres in Section 6 of Loon Lake Township in 1911. The son, Martin, began field work clearing land and harvesting trees at a very early age. When he was 14, they bought a team of black Percherons that became Martin's pride and joy. From then on, he became the chief bread winner. One of the horses, Lottie, lived to be thirty-four years old. Martin married Elva Van Scoy in 1933. The farm was recognized as a Century Farm in 1996.

Victor Larson was the son of Nils and Christinia Larson. Nels "Victor" was born August 18, 1898. He was the eighth child, but was the second child born on the homestead in Loon Lake Township. in 1931, he married Lois Shaffer. In 1931-32, Victor walked two miles and worked in a sawmill for twenty cents an hour. From 1937-79, he owned and lived on 80 acres across from the homestead.

Joyce Cochran was the daughter of Milton & Rebecca Cochran of Loon Lake Township.
