

# Hurrah for the 4th of July!

Walker celebrated its first Fourth of July in 1896 when it welcomed over 300 visitors from the Agency and an excursion train from Brainerd. Events were boats and canoe races, foot and sack races for men and boys, and a tug-o-war. Steamboats carried passengers to the Agency, and several dances were held in the evening.

Walker's Brass Band led the first parade on July 4, 1899, followed by Dreskell's Band from Brainerd, the Red Men from Brainerd and Walker, the White Duck Club (Walker Yacht Club) and Company "A", 7th Infantry. A float represented the 13 original colonies, the Goddess of Liberty, Cuba Libre, and Minnesota. The Heroux Bros. of the Ringle Bros. Circus presented an acrobatic exhibition. At dark steamers played out a



mock battle. As the ships passed, they fired broadside at each other with cannons and rockets.

# Who Doesn't Love Butterflies

Allison Snopek-Barta is a science teacher at the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig high school. In 2011 she began a research project to search, count and document the existence of 88 species of butterflies known to exist in Cass and the surrounding counties in northern Minnesota. Over the past two years, she has discovered the locations of 81 species. The 2012 butterfly season was unbelievable, starting with the warmest March in the history of weather record-keeping here in Minnesota. By October, she had a collection of over 7,000 photos of butterflies. This year with our very late spring, the butterflies are still scarce.

Allison is giving presentations on butterflies at several locations in June and July, including a program at the Cass County Museum in Walker on Tuesday, July 9, at 1:00 p.m. Please join us for this interesting research project which Allison has dubbed, "On the Hunt for the Northwoods Butterflies."
